What is an ECO-Action Project?

A project in which young people get together to take action on an environmental issue of their choice, which in turn has a positive impact on their local and global community and the environment.









YEA 6 Steps to Success Framework

Step 1. Get a team together
Step 2. Select an environmental issue
Step 3. Develop an action plan
Step 4. Take action
Step 5. Raise awareness
Step 6. Reflect

Make sure you record everything!



Step 1. Get a Team Together

Team Size: 2-25 individuals (Optimal group size: 6-8)

Skills Audit & Role Assignment:

- What skills will your team need over the course of the project?
- Who has what skills?
- Match everyone to the role best suited to them for achieving your team goals.

Team Contract:

- Agreements/ground rules that each member will keep
- Discuss how you will work together and resolve group conflicts.



Step 2. Select an Environmental Issue & Research

- What issue most interests, concerns or affects you/your community and the world?
- What causes this issue?
- What impacts does it have on people and the environment?
- What can you do to help?
- How can you motivate others to get involved?

Start with your personal experience. Think outside the box and be creative! THINK outside THE BOX





Step 2. Select an Environmental Issue & Research

Step 3. Develop an Action Plan

1. Overview: What is your project about? 2. Aims: What are the aims of your project? 3. Actions: What actions are you taking?

4. Responsibility: Who is going to carry out what tasks?

5. Timeline: When should the tasks be completed by? Visible Manageable Concrete Sustainable

* An action plan should be structured around the 6 Steps to Success framework and the key dates/deadlines of the YEA programme!




Action Ideas




Activity: Action Plan Mind Map

Step 5. Raise Awareness

It is important to think about how to encourage people to listen to you and increase the reach of your message!





Example: Raising Awareness in Your Community

- Talk to your friends, family and neighbours
- Talk to local businesses to support your cause
- Contact the local paper and radio stations
- Connect with local groups who care about the environmental issue of your choice
- Attend a community fair/event or organise your own
- Give presentations to the public in your local library
- Display posters/information leaflets in your local county councils, shops, and libraries
- Meet with your local TDs/your local county council's Environmental Awareness Officer



Step 6. Reflect

Engaging in critical and reflective thinking helps you to better process your experience and outcomes

Project Evaluation

- Did your project achieve its goals?
- Are there any lessons to be learnt?

Individual Evaluation

- What did you learn by doing this project?
- What skills did you develop?
- What was the most enjoyable and challenging part of your project?





Record Everything!

Your portfolio, including evidence of every action your team has carried out, must be submitted by the February submission deadline.

Submission Requirements

- A4 size scrapbook/folder
- YEA '6 Steps to Success' framework should be used to assist you in completing the portfolio
- Include photos, worksheets, meeting minutes and links to video diary, website, social media, any articles featuring your project
